## LENTEN REGULATIONS

"By the solemn forty days of Lent, the Church united herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, n. 540).

Lent 2010 began on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17, and ends on Holy Thursday, April 1, followed by the Sacred Triduum from the evening of Holy Thursday to Easter, April 4.

### THE FOLLOWING ARE THE REGULATIONS FOR LENT:

All Christians, by nature of their lives, are obliged to live in a spirit of penance whereby our exterior acts of prayer, self-denial and charity bear witness to the inner values of our Faith.

The Church specifies certain practices of penance during the season of Lent.

1. Self-imposed observance of fasting on all weekdays of Lent is strongly recommended.
2. Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17, and Good Friday, April 2.
3. The Fridays of Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
4. Catholics age 14 and older are bound by the law of abstinence.
5. The law of fasting obliges Catholics from age 18-59.
6. The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat.
7. The law of fasting prescribes that only one full meal be taken per day; the other meals should be significantly smaller, but in accord with one's health needs. Fasting assumes avoidance of food between meals.

The "substantial observance" of these laws is a grave obligation; that is:

1. Anyone who neglects all forms of penance, or deliberately shows contempt for the Church's penitential discipline, may be guilty of serious sin.
2. Occasional failure to observe penitential regulations is not seriously sinful.
3. Proportionately grave circumstances - sickness, dietary needs, social obligation - excuse from the obligation of fast and abstinence, but not from seeking out other forms of penance.

## HAITI UPDATE



It has been over 6 weeks since the devastating earthquake hit Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Currently, CRS has a staff of over 300 working to deliver food, water, temporary shelter kits and basic household items. Over 500,000 people have been fed in many different ways since the quake.

Emergency supplies were already in place in a warehouse in Les Cayes - a Haitian town on the southern coast that did not suffer great damage in the quake - and were quickly distributed. Though the port in Port-au-Prince was heavily damaged, CRS was able to unload a shipment of supplies from the US Agency for International Development's Food for Peace program. Once the shipment had been trucked over hastily repaired roads, a voucher system was set-up at the massive camp for displaced people at the Petionville Golf Club. Over 50,000 people received enough food for two weeks. The distribution went so smoothly the system was adopted for use by all the agencies handing out food. The cross that our Haitian brothers and sisters bear, is being eased by your Rice Bowl sacrifices and offerings.
