The procession Scripture from St. Mark's Gospel retells Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Riding on a colt symbolizes that he is not a conqueror or a Roman king, but a Messianic King - a humble suffering servant who will give his life for all seeking salvation. 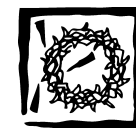
