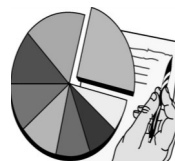

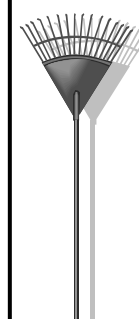

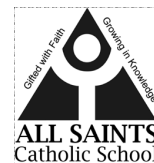
CONFIRMATION/EUCHARIST
