# PASTORAL COUNCIL



The Parish Council wishes to thank outgoing members, Max Kuney, Dale Hendrickson, Gary Berg, Virginia Wallace & Marybeth Kuester for their service to the Council and to the Parish. Additionally, the Council wishes to thank members of the Fellowship Committee for their hard work during the past year. These members were instrumental in planning and serving at the Parish Picnic on June 18, held indoors because of inclement weather. Nonetheless, about 85 parish members attended, feasting on hamburgers, hotdogs and salmon burgers as well as donated desserts. The parish Boy Scout group was on hand to assist with setup and clean up, the Council is grateful to them for their hard work.

New Council members, selected by a process of discernment after nomination by parish members, include Sharon Kistler, Lynn Zysk, and Mike Cressey. Two other male members are being sought.

The council will have its first meeting of the new year on September 19<sup>th</sup>. Two topics will be the focus of 2011-2012 council meetings: first, the incorporation of All Saints School and second, development of a process to create a five year Pastoral Plan for OLF. The incorporation issue was discussed by the OLF Finance Council in 2009-2010 and recommended by Pat Cerutti, who addressed the council last year regarding the merits and process for incorporating the school. At that time, the Council unanimously agreed to support the separate incorporation of All Saints School. The OLF Pastoral and Finance Councils are working in tandem with St. Peter Parish to move the incorporation forward. The Pastoral Plan project will be discussed in terms of making sure parishioners who want to be involved in the process are offered the opportunity to do so.

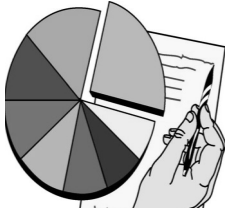
## CODE OF CONDUCT

# FINANCE COUNCIL



The Finance Council is charged with advising our pastor on behalf of the entire parish. Financial concerns cover the budget and parish property in fulfillment of the parish mission. Key to this, the council culminates each fiscal year by developing an annual budget, effective July 1st. The 2011-12 budget projects \$484,013.00 in expenses. This requires an income increase of \$10,263.00 or \$232.00 more each week. It was a hard decision, but there was no other choice. Several areas of spending required the increase. Among them are:

A Diocesan directed salary increase for our pastor, the priests' retirement fund and an increase in medical/dental insurance premiums.

Necessary, long deferred repairs to parish properties.

Liturgical and music supplies necessitated by the implementation of the adoption of the New Roman Missal.

The council is aware that Our Lady of Fatima has not met projected expenses for sometime. However, this can change if every member of the church community responds. We are asking those already giving to increase their donation as much as possible. Additionally, the council is making a specific appeal to all the families who do not presently donate. If each would donate just a few dollars per week or month, our financial obligations could be met. We share a common faith. We also share in the blessings and graces as Church. It is just that all members share the financial costs too. If any one has questions or comments regarding finances, please feel free to contact a member of the council.

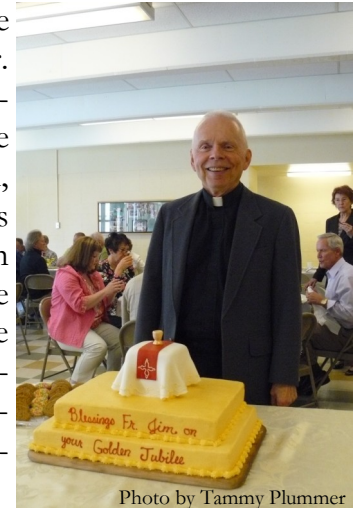

# SOUTHSIDE FOOD BANK



July was a busy and interesting month at the Southside Food Bank. We served about 580 households from our three food lines: *Emergency Food* (includes canned goods, meat, milk and other staples); *Surplus Produce* (produce and bread); and *Senior and WIC Boxes* (pre-packed staple box for those over 60 and children who are 5 and under). *Emergency Food Boxes* and *Senior/WIC Boxes* are available once a month and *Surplus Produce* is available every week.

An interesting statistic popped up when we ran the monthly numbers. The fourth week of July we served 25 NEW clients, most in the 19-54 age group. Normally we see about five new clients. Reason? I'm not really sure. Time will let us know if this is a new trend or just a one-time occurrence.

We thank you for all of the donations to the Food Bank that you leave in the basket in the Gathering Place. We are in need of protein items (peanut butter, tuna, canned meat, soup), cereal and any other packaged items. We do screen our shelves for any recalls that come up, any out-of-date foods, and we do have a shelf for diabetic foods. Second Harvest arranges for Health Department inspections to make sure our food handling procedures are safe.

If you have some time to volunteer, we can always use people on Friday afternoons (set-up day) and Saturday mornings. Again, thanks for all your help.

# GUATEMALA MISSION COMMITTEE

Our Lady of Fatima Parish sponsors 20 girls at Our Lady of Help School in San Andres Semetabaj. This is a residential junior and senior highschool for indigenous girls, run by the Bethlehemite Sisters. I would like to tell you about a student we sponsor. Hermelinda Cosigua Saloj (18). She is from the hamlet of Pixabaj. Her family includes her father, Jose age 42, mother Matea age 40 and six other children - Irma (16), Miriam (12), Silvia (10), Edgar (7), Hector (5) and Vilma (3).

In May of 2010 her father lost his fertilizer and seed store from the effects of tropical storm Agatha. He also had a small farm. Their house and belongings were also lost. The family moved in with their grandmother. Her father goes into Guatemala City to sell vegetables at the market or bus station. Her father informed Hermelinda that he could not afford her education. He told her that she would need to get a job cultivating potatoes, carrots, onions, radishes, beets and cilantro to help her family. When she did not return to school, the sisters went to visit her family. They offered her family a scholarship and school materials. She is doing well in school, although her family cannot afford to visit her. She even stays at school during vacation times. She is grateful to the sisters and Our Lady of Fatima Parish. She wishes to graduate as a Teacher of Home Education and has another dream to enter religious life.

Our Lady of Fatima Parishioners are to be commended for helping this young woman.

This summer, the gardens look the best they have looked in the years we have been doing the gardens. The volunteers that have been helping in the gardens have been doing a wonderful job with the weeding and up-keep. The big news this past spring was the awarding of a grant for a new greenhouse for the *Garden for the Poor*. The greenhouse has been delivered and it will be constructed this fall. The greenhouse will be a new venture for us and we will be working with the students at All Saints.

The other new addition is the concrete planters at the top of the entryway. We would like to thank Curtis Grantz, at Concrete Works in the Spokane Valley, for his assistance in acquiring and installing them. We will have a splash a color next year. We have already had a suggestion for a couple more at the base of the entryway.

This year we have planted mostly pepper and tomato plants. With more volunteers to help tend the gardens next year, we will continue to add to the variety of plants we put in the gardens.

One question asked is: are the gardens a Youth Group project? The answer is that the *Garden for the Poor* was seen as a way for the parish to work together to provide for the poor of our community, especially those served at the House of Charity. Yes, the Youth Group and All Saints School students are a very important part as well as the Boy Scouts who have done projects in the gardens for their Eagle Scout Projects, but all Fatima parishioners are invited to participate.

Thank you again to everyone who has helped in the Garden for the Poor this year.

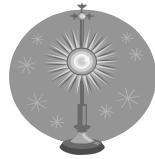

# SOCIAL MINISTRIES



Many months ago, Catholic Charities requested financial assistance to help with the emergency assistance calls they receive. An agreement was made with many parishes for a monthly donation to be given to Catholic Charities for the Emergency Assistance Program. Churches receive numerous calls for financial aid to help pay for an electric bill, water bill, get some gas, have a tooth fixed, pay for diapers, etc. Our Lady of Fatima donates \$500 a month to this program. When our parish office receives calls for help, they are referred to Catholic Charities. This has been very good, in that our office staff does not have to decide whether they should or should not assist someone. Each person Catholic Charities assists, has some case management and some budgeting before a payment is made, and Catholic Charities is in contact with all the social service agencies in the city to avoid duplication of services. This is money well spent, and a tribute to our parish that we are able to do this.
