## FINANCE COUNCIL

Dear Parishioners:

We have completed our first quarter of the year and have begun the work of the Finance Council. First of all, let me welcome our new members, Ernie Becker and Joan Gullickson. I look forward to their many contributions to the Council.

As I indicated to you in my last report, I am providing a copy of the First Quarterly Report along with our finalized budget. As you can see in reviewing the actual numbers versus the budgeted numbers, we are slightly under budget on our actual collections and slightly under budget on our actual expenses. We remain hopeful as we go through the year that collections will increase.

During the prior fiscal year, we asked Parishioners to increase contributions by approximately 8% in order to provide for the budgeted items and hopefully a small cushion. We were unable to do that during last the fiscal year but we are again optimistic that this year our Parishioners will be able to find a way to increase their contributions enough to meet our budget going forward. Father Ty and his staff have done an excellent job in keeping expenses to the minimum necessary for the time being.

We understand the severity of our economic times and are hopeful that conditions will improve sufficiently to allow us to meet the budgeted projections.

We will be working in the next few months on more long range planning issues that need to be addressed.

As always, if anyone of you have any questions or concerns at any time, please do not hesitate to contact me or any of the Council members.

## PASTORAL COUNCIL

Dear fellow Parishioners,

Your Parish Council is off and running on another busy year. As you know, the Parish Council provides input on a wide range of activities and issues at Our Lady of Fatima. This year will be no exception.

With the holiday's fast approaching, the date for the annual Christmas Party has been set. We will celebrate on Sunday, December 12<sup>th</sup>, following the 10:30am Mass with cookies, punch and coffee. I have it on good authority that St. Nick will be dropping by to see the children, complete with family and children's pictures with St. Nick as we did last year.

There are several issues we have just begun discussing, which you will no doubt be hearing more about in the future. These include our five year old parish directory. When is the appropriate time to update it? Another is the new Roman Missal. The Bishop has a task force looking at how other dioceses have implemented it, and we will be discussing the impacts on OLF. Finally, we have begun the discussion of creating a Pastoral Plan.

Parish pastoral planning is an inclusive process that involves consulting all parishioners and a deep reflection on the core values of the parish community. This reflection can focus on a number of areas such as strengths and weaknesses of the parish and creating a mission statement. The goal is to create a set of priorities for the parish over the next 3-5 years, including action steps to achieve those goals. The effort of creating a formal Parish Plan is significant and not one to enter into lightly. Your Parish Council will be examining the plans that other parishes have created, and talking to them about the pro's and con's of the process and the results. We will be reporting back to you, the parishioners, on what we learn over the coming months. ## SOCIAL MINISTRIES



During the Fall Social Ministry Meeting, decisions were made concerning financial assistance to several local organizations, our Blanket & Toiletry Drive and our parish Christmas project - the Tree of Sharing.

**Catholic Charities:** Our parish has been regularly donating \$500 per month to the Catholic Charities Emergency Assistance Fund. Jack Kane, a Jesuit Volunteer at Catholic Charities, is in charge of case management and handles all requests for financial assistance, thus eliminating the duplication of services. Typically the winter months are extremely hard on many in our city. The requests for help increase as temperatures recede, jobs are lost and unemployment benefits run out. Our parish will be doubling our contribution for November & December, sending \$1,000 per month, to help alleviate some of the suffering.

**The South Side Food Bank** has seen an increase in the number of families needing assistance over the last 6 months. Again, do to job loss and a rise in grocery prices, the food bank has become a necessity for many. We will donate \$500 to the Food Bank.

**Our Place Community Ministries,** located in the West Central neighborhood, provides washers, dryers and detergent to those without these necessities. The bills for power and water have risen recently. \$500 will be sent to Our Place for help with these needs.

**Tree of Sharing:** Our parish will be getting names and wish lists from the residents at The Clare House apartments (Moran Prairie) and Hope House (Downtown). The wish lists will come from men, women and children. Their wishes will be attached to our Tree of Sharing which will be on the altar from December 4<sup>th</sup> -20<sup>th</sup>. Feel free to choose a tag and bring the item to place under the tree. If you have the name of someone who you feel should be included please call me. Also, sometimes there is a delayed request or a name was forgotten. To help with these circumstance we will set aside \$200. If the money is not used it will be returned to our fund.

**Blanket & Toiletry Drive:** For the first time this Fall, we will be requested blankets along with toiletries to for those who need the most basic necessities of life. Depending on need, we may schedule a second drive in February. Concern Fellowship joined with Social Ministries in collecting items for the Toiletry Drive.

The recent torrential rains and mudslides caused much devastation in the Solola Diocese in Guatemala. The special needs school, Paths of Hope, in Panajachel, had damage done to the roof of the school. Leaking occurred in the classroom. Our Lady of Fatima is paying to have the roof repaired so that the children will have a dry classroom. We also bought a DVD/TV, stove and a stewing pot for the school.

Judy Schultz, a member of our committee, recently returned from Guatemala. She reported that there was severe damage from the rains. Roads and homes were damaged as well as the crops.

We voted to continue our support of \$2,100 for the seminary in Solola. This seminary provides an excellent education for young men interested in the priesthood.

We will continue to support 20 young women at Our Lady of Hope School in San Andres Semetabaj educating Mayan girls. We will also provide breakfast for the pre-school children run by Sisters Immaculata and Marie in Novillero.

We wish to thank the people of Our Lady of Fatima parish for their generous support for these Mayan people with great needs.

The gardens did not yield as much for the House of Charity as in previous years. This was not a surprise as many gardeners this year had much lower yields. We did have very good luck with cabbage this year. The peppers came on very late and turned out ok. Tomatoes did not do very well, with the exception of the cherry tomatoes. In the end, all the produce that we did take to the House of Charity did make a difference in our outreach to those who take advantage of this ministry.

Thank you to everyone who donated to our Fall fundraiser for the *Garden for the Poor*. Your donations will allow the continued development of the gardens. The focus for the summer of 2011 will be to rebuild the North Garden and redesign Garden #6, which is currently being used to compost. The other area of development will be the introduction of fruit trees to the West end of the property. Research on this project is beginning. Signage will be introduced to name the gardens and put in markers for the Eagle Scout Projects so we don't forget their hard work in the future.

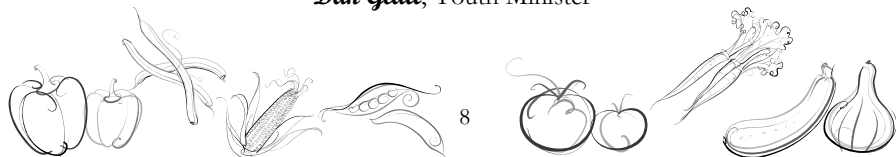
